Victoria: 4 stops to King's Cross

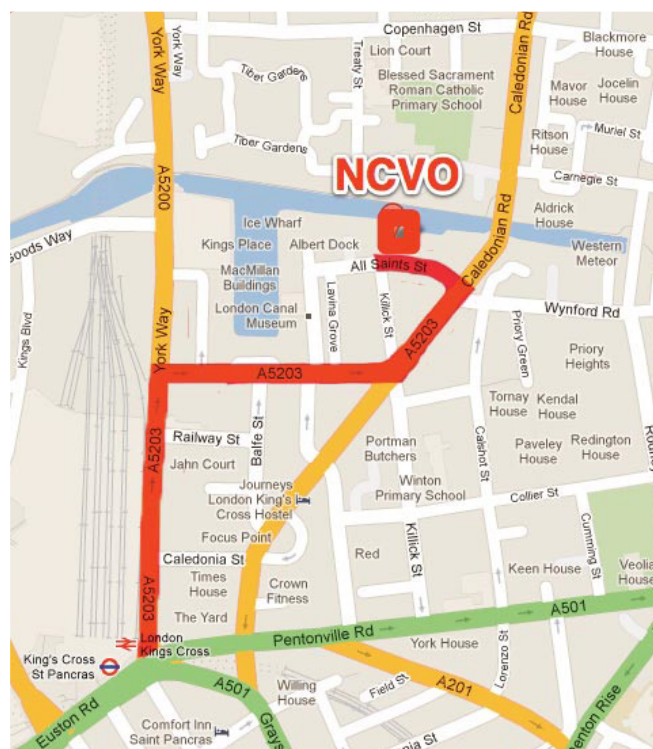
London Liverpool Street: 4 stops to King's Cross
