




METHODS

43%	Knew someone living with HIV




HIV can be passed on through kissing






People living with HIV deserve the same respect and compassion as people living with cancer




If my child was placed in a class at school with a child living with HIV, I would want to have my child moved to a different class


If HIV is effectively managed, they are unable to pass on the virus






The fear of being diagnosed with HIV prevents people from having a test

RESULTS: STIGMA SCORE



LIMITATIONS

- Not enough time for survey troubleshooting and testing
- Ambiguous questions and wording loaded?
- Survey was short not every area explored
- Low sample size not representative of population demographics
- Self-selection bias large proportion knew someone living with HIV
- Largely quantitative data



DISCUSSION

Knowledge and attitudes are generally positive

Little knowledge that undetectable equals untransmittable

Sex and morality is an issue that may be fuelling stigma

Fear of diagnosis prevents testing



"In our Brighton and Hove we are much more aware and there is less stigma but for friends and family further afield there is a deep lack of knowledge."
