



What were my needs:


- Needed urgent access to trans healthcare and gender affirming treatment
- Needed understanding support for mental health
- Needed a non-judgmental space
- Needed Safety and security

How were my needs eventually met


- Attending a young adult clinic understanding my needs, built a good relationship with medical staff
- Taken on by NHS gender clinic pilot project who understand HIV
- Offered mental health support
- Found myself a sense of purpose and started looking after my own wellbeing


