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


Conflict of Interest

Speakers are required by the Federation of the Royal Colleges of Physicians to disclose conflicts of interest at the beginnin g of their presentation, with sufficient time for the information to be read by the audience. They should disclose financial relationships with manufacturers of any commercial product and/or providers of commercial services used on or produced for patients relating to the 36 months prior to the event. These include speaker fees, research grants, fees for other educational activities such as training of health professionals and consultation fees. Where a speaker owns shares or stocks directly in a company producing products or services for healthcare this should also be declared. Positive Voices Data (2022)



- 1 in 10 have not told anybody other than healthcare staff.
- 1 in 5 people were reporting symptoms of either depression or anxiety on the day of the survey.
- Almost half felt ashamed of their status.
- 1 in 3 people reported low self-esteem due to their HIV status.
- 1 in 14 had avoided accessing healthcare services.
- 1 in 7 had worried about being treated differently to other patients by healthcare staff during the previous year.






Stigma

- Fears of stigma and discrimination in health facilities can discourage people from:
 - Accepting HIV testing.
 - Engaging with HIV care and adherence.
 - Accessing other kinds of healthcare.
- Stigma significantly impacts on quality of life and psychological wellbeing.
- UNAIDS estimates that stigma will contribute to an additional 440,000 HIV related deaths between 2020 and 2030.






