Case Studies


Beth

- 52 yrs male, identifies as gay, diagnoses in 2015
- Viral load 297 and CD4 8
- Came to town to die
- DoLS in hospital
- Trust issues
- Family abuse, Children's homes, Lack of education, Street homeless,
- Prison x 2, sex work pimped
- Gun shot to head and other self-harm incidents,
- Splenectomy, Psoriasis, PTSD, Epileptic, COPA, Molluscum, Frailty, Personality disorder.
- Drug use ex iv heroin user and currently smokes hash/weed
- Came onto our caseload angry and defensive and refusing to re commence ARVs on palliative funding.

Madi

- 32 yr old male, diagnosed in 2019 and reluctant to engage
- Viral load 333.000 and CD4 134.
- He lost his job and hit rock bottom, then contacted me
- Accepted that Chem sex was what had made his life so chaotic and the reason for him losing his job.
- From a very religious family, his father was very dominant, and didn't know he identified as being Gay.
- No one other than us, knew about his diagnosis and he was struggling mentally. He had a really good relationship with his mum and he felt he needed to share his diagnosis with her.
- Both seen in clinic and worked through her concerns, there was lots of tears. Her main concern were if her son was going to die.
- I did referrals to lots of different services and he was supported with his addiction to Chems.
