



• HIV rates are still rising in the UK





 Sustainability of testing programmes is under pressure

 Key healthcare professionals are still missing the signs of HIV


And there are significant challenges ahead...

 Many people still avoid HIV testing because of stigma





 Limited access to testing services across a range of settings






We have effective treatments for HIV They increase life expectancy They prevent onwards transmission BUT Only if HIV is diagnosed and treated in time Halve It

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And testing is easier... Rapid Testing – results within 5 minutes Shift from complex pre-counselling to information and brief discussion Can be done in a wider variety of settings





And we are making good progress:

January 2010: The Conservative Party identified HIV as a priority area to tackle in order improve the nation's public health





 All Party Parliamentary Group on HIV and AIDS support secured for Halve It

April 2010: the Halve It position paper 'Early testing saves lives' was published





November 2010: HIV was identified as priority area in Healthy lives Healthy people White Paper, including proposals for a Public Health Outcomes Framework

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
And in 2011:

 February 2011: Halve It submit QOF proposal to NICE. Submission not included in 2012/13 QOF menu





 March 2011: NICE's guidance on testing among men who have sex with men (MSM) and African communities





December 2011: Halve It messages prioritised in key THT policy document

And in 2012:

January 2012: prioritisation of late diagnosis of HIV in the Public Health Outcomes Framework



NHS London Sexual Health Programme

February 2012: Performance improvement indicator across London in primary care

April 2012: NAT QOF updated submitted to NICE (endorsed by Halve It & other key stakeholders)



May 2012: NAT HIV testing Action plan (supports Halve It goals)

June onwards: UK National Screening Committee review of opportunistic testing in general practice, and Department of Health Sexual Health plan (strategy)

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The UK is a leader in Europe

 Increasing numbers of HIV tests undertaken annually since 2000






 UK levels of HIV testing are higher than in many European countries

 More than 50% of all people with HIV in UK have undetectable levels of HIV





What we are asking of government:

 Prioritise HIV testing services, training and education as part of local prevention plans





- Commit to sustaining existing testing service provisions and expand testing services into new settings
- Request the development of local incentives to promote HIV testing





 Ensure that provisions are made to support treatment of increased numbers of newly diagnosed patients







Make contact with your director of Public Health (when they are appointed) and ask if they need any assistance in planning for implementation of the late diagnosis indicator in the public health outcomes framework



Identifying patients with HIV who can get involved with Health and Wellbeing boards (HealthWatch)



Meet/write a letter to your local MP and ask them to contact your local authority and Director of Public Health to urge the importance of HIV testing



Get involved with NATs activist network to raise the profile of HIV testing locally
