Findings cont....





"I mean you are not supposed to give birth in that period. So, we perceived that when they are giving this to us and stay in our body for a long time it will cause harm"...

Fears related to potential harm can be associated with y, mainly due to HIV stigma and worries about potential harm from research interventions.

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"This research was about the product..,. like the gel that you put into the vagina if it can prevent STDs."; "She said they decided to give her AZT because she had had a miscarriage."
