







What can you do about it?

- Frontline staff should be trained to recognise signs of Gender Based Violence & provide regular screening.
- Talk to women about their sexual and reproductive health and rights, pregnancy, U=U, contraception, the menopause
- Provide women centred services and when possible include women only/safe spaces
- Ensure that there are clear pathways for referrals to Peer Support


